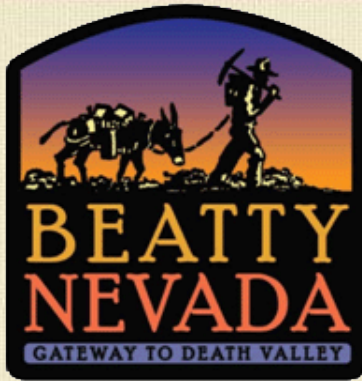

## HISTORY AND BACKGROUND

Beatty is located in southern Nye County approximately 100 miles northwest of Las Vegas and is a major hub along HWY US 95 between Reno and Las Vegas. Beatty is approximately eight miles from Death Valley National Park and has been designated as the “Gateway to Death Valley” since the park was founded in 1937. Beatty was officially trademarked as such along with the Burro and Miner logo with the State of Nevada in 2010. Beatty is approximately 708 square miles and is sparsely populated with just over 1,000 residents, and is Your Gateway to Adventure.

The median age of the population is 50.2 years, with 85.4 percent (863) age 16 and older and 20.8 percent (210) age 65 and older (2012 Census, Beatty CDP).

Historically Beatty has had an expandable/flexible workforce.

The Town of Beatty was formed in the early 1900s as a result of mining exploration in the area and served as the railhead for three separate rail lines including: The Tonopah/Tidewater, Las Vegas/Tonopah, and Bullfrog Goldfield Railroad.
